



The Hellenic University Club, in collaboration with Case Western Reserve University, is sponsoring a presentation by Dr. Coufoudakis on current issues in the Aegean and Cyprus. Coufoudakis is Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs at Indiana University, and author of two books and sixty journal articles published in seven countries. He is a political scientist whose research focuses on post-World War II U.S., Southeastern Europe, the Eastern Mediterranean, and the Middle East. Dr. Coufoudakis has lectured extensively in universities in this country and in Europe including the Foreign Service Institute, the NATO Defense College, the Canadian Institute for International Peace and Security, and many others. Furthermore, he has served as the president of the Modern Greek Studies Association for three terms, and last year Dr. Coufoudakis established the Foundation for Hellenic Studies which is dedicated to the promotion and support of the study of Greece and Cyprus in the United States.
